



# What you need to know?

Format of the TOEFL iBT Test The TOEFL iBT test consists of 4 sections: Reading, Listening, Speaking, and Writing. Instructions for answering questions are given within each section. There is no computer tutorial.

The chart below shows the range of questions and the timing for each section. The time limit for each section varies according to the number of questions

## TOEFL 10-Points to Know

### 1. Familiarize Yourself with the Format

Understand the structure of the TOEFL test, including the four sections: Reading, Listening, Speaking, and Writing.

Review sample questions and practice tests to get comfortable with the format.

### 2. Develop a Study Plan

Create a study schedule that allows you to cover all sections of the test.

Allocate more time to sections where you feel less confident.

### 3. Improve Your Vocabulary

Build a strong vocabulary by learning new words and their usage.

Use vocabulary lists, flashcards, or apps to reinforce your learning.

### 4. Practice Reading Comprehension



# Writing Plan

## SPEAKING

You will speak into a microphone in the computer a grader will listen to you recorded answers and will grade you at a later date.

- takes about 20 minutes.
- six questions

## IELTS

means

International English Language  
Testing System

- takes 12 to 14 minutes
- takes place with an examiner, rather than a computer
- brief introductory conversation
- short questions about familiar topics.



## WRITING

### Two Tasks

- short essay on a given topic (50-300 words)
- summarize information from a text and a lecture you will need to either compare and contrast or synthesize conflicting information.

### Two Tasks

- short essay of (200-250 words)
- summarize/interpret the information presented from an infographic/graph



## READING

- 3-5 reading selections (20 minutes each)
- reading materials are academic in nature
- questions are multiple choice

- 3 reading selections of 20 minutes each from academic textbooks or from a newspaper or magazine.
- multiple type questions


